CASTLETON'S DOLLY MADISON PATTERN WITH GINNY DAVID

Castleton China had many names over its long history. In 1901 it opened as New Castle China, then it acquired Shenango Pottery and used that name for several years. Castleton got its start when Mr. Louis Helleman, formerly a rep for Rosenthal China of Germany, contracted with Shenango China to make some of Rosenthal's shapes and pattern prior to WWII. The goal of the merger was to combine age-old European craftsmanship with superior American technology.

Castleton was incorporated in 1940. Shenango purchased the remaining stock of Castleton in 1951 and production continued until 1976. Fourteen different patterns were produced including commemorative Presidential plates at the request of Mamie Eisenhower and Lady Bird Johnson.

Ginny's parents had a complete set for twelve of the Dolly Madison pattern that was produced from 1950-1972. Pictured are a place setting and several serving pieces including the teapot, which is available on Replacements, Ltd. for \$650!!! Wow, what a surprise!! She has complemented the china with her parents' Rogers gold-plated flatware, goblets with a rose and gold trim, and a Heisey New Era double candleholder

that her mom usually used on the table.
