### JULY MEETING NOTES

We enjoyed a delicious potluck picnic at our July meeting. Thanks to Barbara Coleman and Carole Bess White for preparing the turkey and hams, and thanks to all our members who brought wonderful salads, side dishes and desserts to round out the meal.

Our tradition is to feature a display by Elmer Heffner at our potlucks, and this time he brought Fenton's Rosalene color. Rosalene was first made by Frederick Carder of Steuben Glass. Fenton made Rosalene in the 1960s after their success with Burmese glass. Rosalene is not pink slag glass—slag has swirls of other colors in it. Rosalene is a heat-sensitive glass containing gold that shows up as a strong pink when heat struck—re-heated to the correct temperature to achieve the desired color.

Fenton chemist Charlie Goe began development of Rosalene but passed away before it was perfected. Dr. Subodh Gupta joined Fenton in 1973 and worked with Frank Fenton on trying to make Rosalene less corrosive to the equipment. Frank came up with the name "Rosalene," and the color was introduced in 1973. It proved too expensive and difficult to make and was discontinued in 1979.

Rosalene was reissued every so often such as the 1990s "Rosebuds on Rosalene" and "Violets on Rosalene."

Some of Elmer's pieces include a temple jar sandblasted by Kelsey Murphy and Robert Bomkamp; one of his two epergnes (that's nothing—his son has nine of them!); a tumble up night set made for QVC; a "Chessie Cat" covered candy (named for the Chesapeake & Ohio RR advertising icon); and a fishbowl.
