THISTLE COLLECTIBLES with EDNA McLEAN

As a small child, Edna admired the pretty, prickly purple flowers that her family ripped out as soon as they saw them. They were thistles, a member of the daisy family, and motif people consider them pests. Then when she had a summer job at a fire lookout, a little thistle took root, but her boss dug it up.

So she resorted to collecting objects with thistle on them. Her first pieces were Higbee Thistle dishes that she bought from Jennie Welch of Welch's Antiques. When Jennie died in 1985, her family found some more Thistle items that had Edna's name on them, so she was able to purchase those as well.

Edna was only going to collect thistle glass, but then one day she was in a Vancouver, B.C. antique shop and found a thistle-decorated piece of china, so she branched out and the rest is history!

Among the pieces Edna showed were a honeycomb dish, a pair of metal candleholders she purchased in Scotland, a horse brass with a thistle, Many cups and saucers, a set of dishes, a red cut-to-clear Czech vase, a Fenton thistle piece and a cookie press that she used to make the delicious shortbread cookies she brought to the meeting.
